


A Message From The President

A patron saint can not only represent a city, but also be regarded as the heavenly advocate of a nation, profession, or even a family. Traditionally the patron saint prays for that place's wellbeing and for the health and happiness of its inhabitants. In Italy most cities will celebrate their specific Patron Saint Day by proclaiming a holiday; there is no school, and offices, banks, retail stores, and services are closed for the day.

Some patron saints of Italian cities include:

Milan - St Ambrose - December 7 Assisi - St Francis - October 4 Venice - St Mark - April 25 Rome - St Peter - June 29

Interesting curiosity: Italians will also celebrate when their first name corresponds to the Saint's day. For example, a person named Peter will celebrate his personal Saint's Day (called onomastico in Italian) on June 29. A person named Francis (or Frank or Frances) will celebrate their onomastico on October 4th.

I hope to have captured your interest in patron saints. I invite those of you of Italian descent to try and find the patron saint of the city your family originated from. It is also fun to find the Saint's Day corresponding to your first name.

Please support the efforts of the Italian American Cultural Center of Iowa in order to spread Italian culture throughout your community.



Turin - A Vibrant Soul

Turin is one of Italy's least known cities. While most travelers head to the triptych Rome-Florence-Venice, Turin is off most tourists' radar. But Turin is my home town. And so I drew up a small (and rather unconventional) list of ideas and suggestions to discover one of Italy's best kept secrets. Let's go!

#1. Stroll through the narrow streets around Piazza Castello.

When walking through the center of Turin, keep your nose up so as not to miss any of the beautiful historic buildings. In Via dei Stampatori, one of the oldest streets in town, you will be surprised by the beautiful frescoed façade of Palazzo Scaglia di Verrua— a Renaissance structure with original authentic frescoes still clearly visible on the façade. The Palazzo gate is closed most of the time, but if you wait long enough to peek inside you'll be rewarded— a loggia, delicate arched windows and other fine frescoes await you.

#2. A city surrounded by the Alps.

The view from Monte dei Cappuccini across the rooftops of Turin with the Alps in the background is stunning. Look North and you can see floating mountains stretching into the endless horizon. Directly below, a bird's eye view over the entire city. The Mole Antonelliana also offers breathtaking panoramas. Take the elevator to the top floor, but students beware as local legend holds that students who head to the top to enjoy the view won't graduate! Closer to the Alps and only 40 km from Turin, the Sacra of San Michele is an ancient abbey built between 983 and 987 on the top of a mountain. This monument is a symbol of the Piedmont Region and a place that inspired Umberto Eco's Best Seller The name of the rose. From its lofty towers you can admire Turin and a breathtaking view of the Val di Susa.

#3. Visit three of the most important museums in Italy.

The Museum of Cinema housed inside the Mole Antonelliana for connoisseurs of the history of film making; The Egyptian Museum, second only to Cairo; and the Museum of Italian Unification located inside the Palazzo Carignano—a beautiful baroque building and home to the first Italian parliament.







#4 A café unlike any other.

Turin is also a city of old cafés. Those with wooden counters, boiseries, marble tables, inlays and mirrors with gilded frames. It is here that you can find the bicerin (espresso, drinking chocolate, and whole milk served layered in a small rounded glass), invented right here in Turin, that has become the city's emblematic drink.

#5 Look for strange buildings.

I recommend three of them. The first one has its nose pierced. That's right: "Stolen kisses" is a palace that has just been pierced by a huge ring-shaped piercing. Drops of blood gush on either side of the ring, on one side the blood is red and on the other it is blue, representing the noble and proletarian soul of this city.

The second is known as the "Slice of Polenta". High, narrow and yellow like a section of fried polenta, the building is sharpened more and more until it is only 21 inches wide! Bizarre but robust, it was built in the middle of the 19th century.

The third building is the most beautiful house in the world! The renowned architects' magazine Archdaily, awarded this prize to #6 Palazzo Valperga Galleani—a baroque palace and a super-technological condominium that houses a vertical garden.

#6 Amble along the river bank.

Visit Valentino Park, Turin's largest green space, located next to the River Po. Make sure you tour the Valentino Castle, a UNESCO World Heritage site, that offers wonderful frescoes and paintings as well luxurious interiors. Do not forget to look for the works of famous artists-gardeners. An example? These two lamp posts in love that, perhaps, after having been facing each other for years, have decided to sit on this bench to declare their true sentiments.

In truth, Turin offers all this and so much more to the visitor who seeks the unconventional in a city with a vibrant soul.



Turin, the fourth-largest city by population, is the capital city of Piedmont in northern Italy, known for its refined architecture and cuisine.

What Is Genetic Ancestry Testing?

Genetic ancestry (DNA) testing is a way for people interested in family history to go beyond what they can learn from relatives or from historical documentation. Examination of DNA variations can provide clues about from where a person's ancestors might have come and about relationships between families. Certain patterns of genetic variation are often shared among people of particular backgrounds. The more closely related two individuals, families, or populations are, the more patterns of variation they typically share. Three types of DNA testing are commonly used for genealogy:

Y chromosome testing: Variations in the Y chromosome, passed exclusively from father to son, can be used to explore ancestry in the direct male line. Y chromosome testing can only be done on males, because females do not have a Y chromosome.

Mitochondrial DNA testing: This type of testing identifies genetic variations in mitochondrial DNA. Although most DNA is packaged in chromosomes within the cell nucleus, cell structures called mitochondria also have a small amount of their own DNA. Both males and females have mitochondrial DNA, which is passed on from their mothers, so this type of testing can be used by either sex. It provides information about the direct female ancestral line.

Single nucleotide polymorphism testing: These tests evaluate large numbers of variations across a person's entire genome. The results are compared with those of others who have taken the tests to provide an estimate of a person's ethnic background.

What can you expect to learn from your results? An individual's DNA test provides little information on its own. It is not possible to take these numbers, plug them into a formula, and find out who your ancestors are. The marker numbers provided in your DNA test results only begin to take on genealogical signifiance when you compare your results with other people and population studies. If you don't have a group of relatives interested in pursuing DNA testing with you, your only real option is to input your DNA test results into many DNA databases on the Net, in the hopes of finding a match with someone who has already been tested.

In conclusion, it is vitally important to keep in mind that DNA testing for the purpose of proving ancestry is NOT a substitute for traditional family history research. Instead, it is a tool to be used in conjunction with family history research to aid in proving or disproving suspected family relationships. It is definitely an exciting new tool!

Several friends and supporters of the Italian-American Cultural Center of Iowa have generously donated clothing from the various regions of Italy. I have listed here those items that we have on display at the Cultural Center.

"Over 30 years ago, relatives of our grandparents in Scala Coeli, in the region of Calabria, handmade a festive outfit befitting the region and village and sent it to our daughter. In memory of James and Teresa Lacona, we would like to donate the outfit to the Italian-American Cultural Center of Iowa to preserve history." This note came to us, along with the outfit, from James Noah and Norabeth Lacona, Tiffany Lacona, James Noah Lacona II, and Chelsea Lacona. A picture of Tiffany wearing the outfit accompanies the dress.

Nicole Graziano donated a skirt that her great-grandmother, Maria (Agazio) Gemelli, made in Italy before she came to the United States around 1912. Her aunt told her that Maria wore the skirt to festivals in her home town of Cariati, Italy.

The Vincent DeAngelis family donated a dress that Catherine (Renda) DeAngelis wore in Tiriolo, Italy. The mountain village of Tiriolo is the home of the Renda family. When the five brothers immigrated to this country they worked for the railroad. While two of the brothers kept the name Renda, some of the brothers changed their last name to Rand or Randa. In display is a dress from Tiriolo that was made for Patricia (Rand) Civitate. She also has an outfit made for her by the nuns in a convent in Tagliacozzi, Italy.

A dress from Friuli was donated by Rita Tonitto, formerly of Ft. Lee, NJ, and now living in Florida.

In the clothing collection are two men's outfits from Piedmont. They were donated by the late Victor Guigliuzi and Victor Peck. One is a Sunday outfit and the other a festival suit.



Capellini Carbonara

(Pasta with Bacon & Prosciutto) by Erminio Elia of Niagara Falls Canada

1/2 lb angel hair pasta, cooked and strained

2 T olive oil

4 strips bacon

1/2 C chicken stock

2 T butter

4 slices prosciutto

½ C Parmesan-reggio cheese, grated

2 shallots

½ C white wine

2 egg yolks

Heat olive oil and butter in pan over medium heat. Finely chop shallots, bacon and prosciutto and add to pan. Saute until lightly browned. Add wine and chicken stock, cook for 2 minutes over high heat. Add cooked pasta, cheese and egg yolks. Stir vigorously over high heat until pasta is coated and creamy. Plate, top with grated Parmesan-reggio and serve immediately.
